

How would you know which makeup school offers the better program? Below is a filtering system to narrow down your search.

- 1- **Quality of the program:** The most important element would be the school's satisfactory results and educational content. For this you may check their student works on their website.

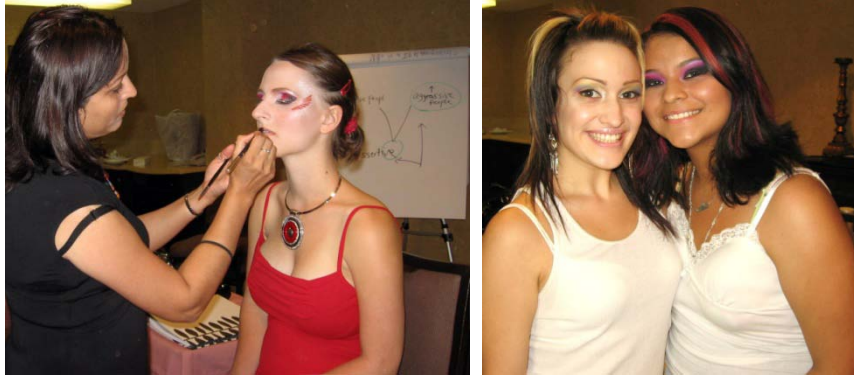
- 2- **Costs and tuition:** After narrowing down your search with a selection of the makeup schools with the **best results** then you may compare the **tuition** for the schools that produce a **similar quality result**. Never compare schools costs if the two schools do not have the same quality of education.

- 3- **Hidden fees and surprise costs:** Check to see if there are any hidden costs or mandatory purchases. See if school tuition is **published**. Make sure their fees are published on their website and ask questions about all the fees, costs and policies.
